2006 Annual Report

A summary presentation of the 2006 Annual Report was given by the President. The 2006 Annual Report has been circulated and there has been great feedback regarding the quality and content of the revised format.

The President thanked Paul, Sandra and all that contributed to the 2006 Annual Report.

- Increase in capability
- Commonwealth Games Results President complimented the team, coaches, managers and support staff for the outstanding achievements
- Membership survey 5.1 in 2004 to 7.6 in 2006– President complimented staff on achievements
- Website Live results and re-branding
- Re-writing on ASTA and placement on the NZQA Framework

The President thanked everybody from Swimming New Zealand for their contribution to a remarkable year. SNZ Competitions have again stepped up, with officials, swimmers achieving great results and outstanding media coverage. Thank you to everyone, looking forward to 2007.

The President noted that the Board is very proud and privileged to work with CEO, Paul Veric and endorse the direction that he is taking Swimming New Zealand.

Financial Statements

David Jack – Chair of Audit and Finance spoke to the Financial Statements within the 2006 Annual Report (page 25 of the SNZ Annual Report).

In summary there has been a huge lift in activity on both sides of income and expenditure. An increase in income primarily comes directly from investment from SPARC (2.3m) which is two thirds of SNZ income. This increase has been well earned and congratulations to Clive Rushton for being persuasive and presenting a great case to SPARC. Congratulations and thanks to the swimmers for achieving the targets set.

Other income streams are detailed on Pg 39, with Gaming Trusts, Paul and team able to achieve grants of 430,000 as well as 230,000 towards swimming education programmes.

The figures are direct SNZ finances. The SNZ Rewards scheme of \$35,000 is in a separate bank account as requested by the membership. The finances are formatted into deliverable categories (line items) detailing performance output rather than basic salaries, travel etc.

There has been increased investment in events, communication, marketing and branding. Media (including regular press releases) as well as substantial investment in membership services through the service delivery project has also occurred.
